30 Daily Devotional Lessons on the Life of Christ in KJV for memorization and study, includes first-letter helps – By Donna Nicholas

♥Introduction - Sealing Love Memory Studies

Since conditions in our world cry for the last message of mercy to be sounded more clearly, these Sealing Love Memory Studies come to you to hasten its happening. The last message to go forth is a manifestation of Jesus' character of love—a revelation found in the Bible.

Our Lord has autographed that message with His own blood, and His love is poured out for us on every page. Thus His character of love is clearly seen in these memory lessons—from the words of His conception in Mary's womb through the story of His ascension to heaven. Memorization of these verses enables us to bring His life into our life. Their power transforms our nature and re-creates our soul in His image.

First, repeat the text of the first lesson, Gabriel's Visit To Mary, Luke 1:26-38, and DA22-3, then read the whole study. To start memorizing, read only the first verse. Practice with first-letter helps—reviewing any word you can't recall. As soon as you can recite this verse with no help, read the second verse, then practice it with first-letter helps. Proceed until you can recite the first two verses with no help. Using the same process, continue with as many verses as you can successfully remember. Don't be discouraged if it's only one. However many, carry the words in your mind all day while you contemplate the insight they impart of Jesus.

Counsel directs us to spend a quiet hour every day in these thoughts. The memory studies provide a means to spend an hour, or a half-hour or even a few minutes considering Jesus' life. Carry the lessons on walks, practice verses while you drive, take your memory book everywhere

you go to make it possible to spend every free minute with the Lord. Soon you won't need the book because the words will be etched in your memory. And those words in your mind bring His life into your life.

Worldly enticements lose their hold as this One fairest of 10,000 and altogether lovely takes abode within. The love that daily grows in our heart brings with it an urgency to share what we know of Him: His prayer, "Forgive them," while soldiers drove spikes through His hands and feet; His awesome decision on the cross, "I won't go back to heaven without them, even if it costs Me My eternity,"—a commitment He made while the guilt of our sin shut Him from His Father's love; His intercession today before the Father, "I engraved them on the palms of My hands. They live constantly in My memory. I want them to set Me as a seal upon their hearts."

The life of Jesus studies hidden in the mind bring an answer to His prayer to seal hearts to Him. They draw the learner to a life and character that manifest His glory. Through each one, Jesus sends His last message of mercy to the world—a revelation of His character of love. By every person, He echoes His call, "Come." The power of His life in the human agent draws others. These take their place in this great company of people whose hearts are sealed to Jesus. Again, the world is turned upside down by disciples aflame with love for the Lord. The work is finished. We look at the Eastern sky to see the fulfillment of His promise: "I will come again and receive you unto Myself!"

- 10 And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand.
- 11 And Jesus took the loaves; and when He had given thanks, He distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that were set down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.

- 12 When they were filled, He said unto His disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost.
- 13 Therefore they gathered them together, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which remained over and above unto them that had eaten.
- 14 Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, This is of a truth that Prophet that should come into the world.

"The people listened to the words of mercy flowing so freely from the lips of the Son of God. They heard the gracious words, so simple and so plain that they were as the balm of Gilead to their souls. The healing of His divine hand brought gladness and life to the dying, and ease and health to those suffering with disease. The day seemed to them like heaven upon earth, and they were utterly unconscious of how long it had been since they had eaten anything. . . . The disciples finally came to Him, urging that for their own sake the people should be sent away. . . . But Jesus said, 'Give ye them to eat.' . . . In full reliance upon God, Jesus took the small store of loaves; and although there was but a small portion for His own family of disciples, He did not invite them to eat, but began to distribute to them, bidding them serve the people. The food multiplied in His hands; and the hands of the disciples, reaching out to Christ Himself the Bread of Life, were never empty. The little store was sufficient for all." DA365-70

He knew how sorely their faith was to be tried. In this incident on the sea He desired to reveal to Peter his own weakness,—to show that his safety was in constant dependence upon divine power. . . . No sooner had Jesus taken His place in the boat than the wind ceased, 'and immediately the ship was at the land whither they went.' The night of horror was succeeded by the light of dawn. The disciples, and others who also were on board, bowed at the feet of Jesus with thankful hearts, saying, 'Of a truth Thou art the Son of God!'" DA381-2

Moses and Elijah had been colaborers with Christ. They had shared His longing for the salvation of men. . . . - 8 For the poor always ye have with you; but Me ye have not always.
- 9 Much people of the Jews therefore knew that He was there: and they came not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might see Lazarus also, whom He had raised from the dead.
- 10 But the chief priests consulted that they might put Lazarus also to death;
- 11 Because that by reason of him many of the Jews went away, and believed on Jesus.

"She had heard Jesus speak of His approaching death, and in her deep love and sorrow she had longed to show Him honor. At great personal sacrifice she had purchased an alabaster box of 'ointment of spikenard, very costly,' with which to anoint His body. But now many were declaring that He was about to be crowned king. Her grief was turned to joy, and she was eager to be first in honoring her Lord. It would be needful for His church in all succeeding ages to make His death for the sins of the world a subject of deep thought and study. Every fact connected with it should be verified beyond a doubt. . . . After such a demonstration as that attending His entry into Jerusalem, all eyes would follow His rapid progress to the final scene." DA571

- 34 Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. And they parted His raiment, and cast lots.
- 35 And the people stood beholding. And the rulers also with them derided Him, saying, He saved others; let Him save Himself, if He be Christ, the chosen of God.
- 36 And the soldiers also mocked Him, coming to Him, and offering Him vinegar,
- 37 And saying, If Thou be the King of the Jews, save Thyself.
- 38 And a superscription also was written over Him in letters of Greek, and Latin, and Hebrew, THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS.
- 39 And one of the malefactors which were hanged railed on Him, saying, If Thou be Christ, save Thyself and us.
- 40 But the other answering rebuked him, saying, Dost not thou fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?
- 41 And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds: but this Man hath done nothing amiss.

- 42 And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when Thou comest into Thy kingdom.
- 43 And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with Me in Paradise.
- 44 And it was about the sixth hour, and there was a darkness over all the earth until the ninth hour

The spotless Son of God hung upon the cross, His flesh lacerated with stripes; those hands so often reached out in blessing, nailed to the wooden bars; those feet so tireless on ministries of love, spiked to the tree; that royal head pierced by the crown of thorns; those quivering lips shaped to the cry of woe. And all that He endured—the blood drops that flowed from His head, His hands, His feet, the agony that racked His frame, and the unutterable anguish that filled His soul at the hiding of His Father's face—speaks to each child of humanity, declaring, It is for thee that the Son of God consents to bear this burden of guilt; for thee He spoils the domain of death, and opens the gates of Paradise. He who stilled the angry waves and walked the foam-capped billows, who made devils tremble and disease flee, who opened blind eyes and called forth the dead to life,—offers Himself upon the cross as a sacrifice, and this from love to thee." DA755

- 33 But when they came to Jesus, and saw that He was dead already, they brake not His legs:
- 34 But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced His side, and forthwith came there out blood and water.
- 35 And he that saw it bare record, and his record is true: and he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe.
- 36 For these things were done, that the Scripture should be fulfilled, A bone of Him shall not be broken.
- 37 And again another Scripture saith, They shall look on Him whom they pierced.
- 38 And after this Joseph of Arimathaea, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, besought Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus: and Pilate gave him leave. He came therefore, and took the body of Jesus.
- 39 And there came also Nicodemus, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about an hundred pound weight.

- 40 Then took they the body of Jesus, and wound it in linen clothes with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to bury.
- 41 Now in the place where He was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid.
- 42 There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation day; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand.

"But it was not the spear thrust, it was not the pain of the cross, that caused the death of Jesus. That cry, uttered 'with a loud voice,' at the moment of death, the stream of blood and water that flowed from His side, declared that He died of a broken heart. His heart was broken by mental anguish. He was slain by the sin of the world. With the death of Christ the hopes of His disciples perished. They looked upon His closed eyelids and drooping head, His hair matted with blood, His pierced hands and feet, and their anguish was indescribable. Until the last they had not believed that He would die; they could hardly believe that He was really dead. Overwhelmed with sorrow, they did not recall His words foretelling this very scene. Nothing that He had said now gave them comfort. They saw only the cross and its bleeding Victim. The future seemed dark with despair. Their faith in Jesus had perished; but never had they loved their Lord as now. Never before had they so felt His worth, and their need of His presence." DA772
